B': The particular volumes of the *Ekklesiastike Aletheia* (pp. 289–334). Prof. Krikonis turns his attention to another periodical of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, namely *Neos Poimen*, five volumes, 1919–1923, a theological supplement of *Ekklesiastike Aletheia*.

Stavros T. Anestidis, *Μικρασιατικὰ Χρονικά*, Vols. 1 (1938) – 17 (1980), *Δελτίο Κέντρου Μικρασιατικῶν Σπουδῶν* 5 (1984–1985) 425–501.

*Mikrasiatika Chronika* is a journal dealing with matters related to the life, culture, and history of the Greek Church and nation in Asia Minor throughout the centuries. Several well-known Greek scholars appear as regular contributors to this periodical.

Stavros T. Anastasidis, a young scholar, prepared a cumulative index to the contents of this journal, vols. I (1928) – XVII (1980) in *Deltio Kentrou Mikrasiastikon Spoudon* 5 (1984–1985) 425–501. He follows the classical division of material by first presenting the entries to the articles: a) studies, b) bibliographies — book reviews, c) necrologies, d) chronicals, e) decoration, f) autographs, g) alphabetical indices, and secondly the General Indices (by name and subject matter).

Vol. XVIII of *Mikrasiatika Chronika* appeared in the year 1988, on the completion of the 50th year anniversary in the life of this periodical.

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
